Overview

- The LA Law Library was established in 1891
- The current building was opened in 1953
- Largest print collection in a public law library west of the Mississippi River
- Seven floors
- 35 miles of shelving
- 1,000,000 equivalent volumes including print and digital

What is a Will

- A will is a document that specifies who will receive your assets and when
- It will appoint someone to handle your affairs

Types of Wills

Holographic Will



Printed Will

Holographic Will

- Needs to be in your own handwriting
- Needs to be signed and dated by you
- Key terms need to be in your handwriting
- Does NOT need to be witnessed

Probate Code Section 6111

Printed Will

- Should specify that it is your Last Will and Testament (or testamentary intent is clear)
- Must be signed by you in the presence of 2 witnesses
- Those witnesses must sign and date *Probate Code Section 6110*

Self Proving Printed Will

A will is self proving when the witness signs under penalty of perjury that they witnessed the will maker sign the document and the will maker told them it was his will.

Self Proving Printed Will

Witnesses must also sign in the presence of one another and the will maker

What is a Trust

A contract you make with yourself wherein you specify who will receive your assets and when they will receive them

A Trust May Also

Plan for Incapacity
Designate Guardians for Minors
Protect Assets
Avoid Tax Consequences



Two Main Types of Trusts

- Revocable Trusts
- Irrevocable Trusts

Most Common Trust

Revocable Living Trust



Irrevocable Trust

Not Revocable (of course there are exceptions)

Used primarily for asset protection and avoiding certain tax consequences

Benefits to Having a Trust

- · Avoids probate
- May also use it to plan for possible incapacity (avoids need for Conservatorship)
- Protects Assets from MediCal Recovery
- Transfers and Protects Generational Wealth
- Asset Protection
- Minimize or Avoid Tax Consequences



A Will Alone Does Not Avoid Probate

Probate is a court supervised process that takes <u>time</u> and <u>money.</u>



Required if someone passes away with assets over \$150,000 in their estate.

What does Probate Costs

CA law states that probate attorneys receive a percentage of the gross value of the estate.

4% of the first \$100,000 3% of the next \$100,000 2% of the next \$800,000



\$23,000 in Attorneys Fees for a \$900,000 Estate Probate Code Section 10810



 - Executor
 - Beneficiary
 - Witness
 - Devise
 - Devisee



What to include in your Will

Name the person who is to be <u>executor</u> and what their duties are

- Do they have a key to your apartment, condo or home?
- Do they have a copy of your will?
- If not, do they know where to find it?

Trust Terms

- Grantor/ Trustor- the person that creates the trust
- Trustee- person who manages the trust property
- Successor Trustee- person who takes over after initial trustee resigns, dies or is incapacitated
- Beneficiary- person who receives the trust property

Power of Attorney

• Gives power to your agent to manage your financial affairs while you are living

Advanced Health Care Directive

Gives power to your agent to make medical decisions for you in the event you are not able to do so

- DNR
- Life Support



Trust Transfer Deed

Transfers property to your trust. You must have this in order to transfer your home or other real estate into the name of the trust.

Transfer on Death Deed

CA now has a deed that will you allow you to transfer your home to someone upon your death

LALAWLIBRARY

Transfer on Death Deed

Pros

- Protects property from probate
- Inexpensive and fast
- Fully revocable
- No taxes, its considered a gift

Cons

- If beneficiary predeceases you, subject to probate
- No ability to plan for incapacity
- Property still subject to MediCal recovery
- If you have a co tenant (owner), won't work

I have a retirement plan (401K or 453b) should I place this in my trust?





You do <u>not</u> want to transfer ownership of your 401K to your trust

BUT

You may want to name your trust as a beneficiary in **SOME** cases

Minors or Others that you may not want to receive lump sums

Secure Act of 2019

Do you have a 401K or IRA?

Inherited IRA distribution must now be taken within 10 years

Previously, if you inherited an IRA you could stretch out its distributions

Secure Act of 2019

Must withdraw and pay taxes on distributions from inherited IRA's within 10 years after death

Be careful of the type of trust used for this and be aware of 10 year limit



2017 MediCal Recovery Act

OLD LAW - If you received Medi-Cal and you owned a home, the state could recover by attaching a lien to your home

NEW LAW- your home can be protected through a revocable trust




